WHAT IS College?

College is a great option after GCSEs or when you finish education at 16 because you can study a large range of courses, across all levels, on a campus with staff dedicated to teaching 16-18 year-olds.

Truro and Penwith College is called a Tertiary FE College. FE stands for Further Education and Tertiary means we offer academic and vocational courses for school leavers and people aged 19+. This means you can even do a University degree at the College!

Truro and Penwith College has three campuses: Penwith College in Penzance, Truro College in Truro and the brand new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) and Health Skills Centre in Bodmin. Each is made up of modern buildings, specialising in certain subjects.

Truro and Penwith College is run by a Principal (what schools call a Headteacher) and our teachers are called tutors.

INSIDER TIP

Penwith College is perfect if you live within a 30-minute drive of Penzance.

Truro College students come from schools across the whole of Cornwall.

If you live in north or east Cornwall, and love Engineering, Digital or Health subjects, our STEM and Health Skills Centre, Bodmin could be the best choice for you.

It's good to stay focused on the core subjects at GCSE Level -Maths and English. You'll need to pass these to go onto most, not all, courses after school.

WHAT IS COLLEGE ACTUALLY LIKE?

Studying at Truro and Penwith College is different to school or sixth form. You will become a student, get more independence and have more responsibility to manage your own time.

You'll learn lots, in lessons and around the College, mix with like-minded people and have fun, supported by friendly tutors and support teams.

It's less formal than school too. You'll call staff by their first names and there's no uniform. A normal College day starts at 9.15am with lectures finishing by 4.15pm. A typical class has about 20 students and there are a variety of places to eat, hang out and make the most of the facilities and kit.

WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS?

At Truro and Penwith College, you can choose a variety of subjects that interest you, with a Level 3 A Level programme or the IB Diploma, or specialise on a T Level or Vocational Diploma. You may decide classroom-based learning isn't for you and start an Apprenticeship, learning while at work.

MIX & MATCH

Choose 3 A Levels from over 40 subjects. It's a good way of keeping your options open and a great route to university.

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Vocational Diplomas are more hands-APPRENTICESHIPS on and work-focused and usually cover one subject area. They can be equivalent to three A Levels.

A WORLD OF **OPPORTUNITY** The **IB Diploma** is an

internationally recognised University entry qualification.

Students study three subjects at Higher Level and three at Standard l evel.

NEXT LEVEL T Levels combine classroom theory and practical learning with an extended industry placement of 45 days.
