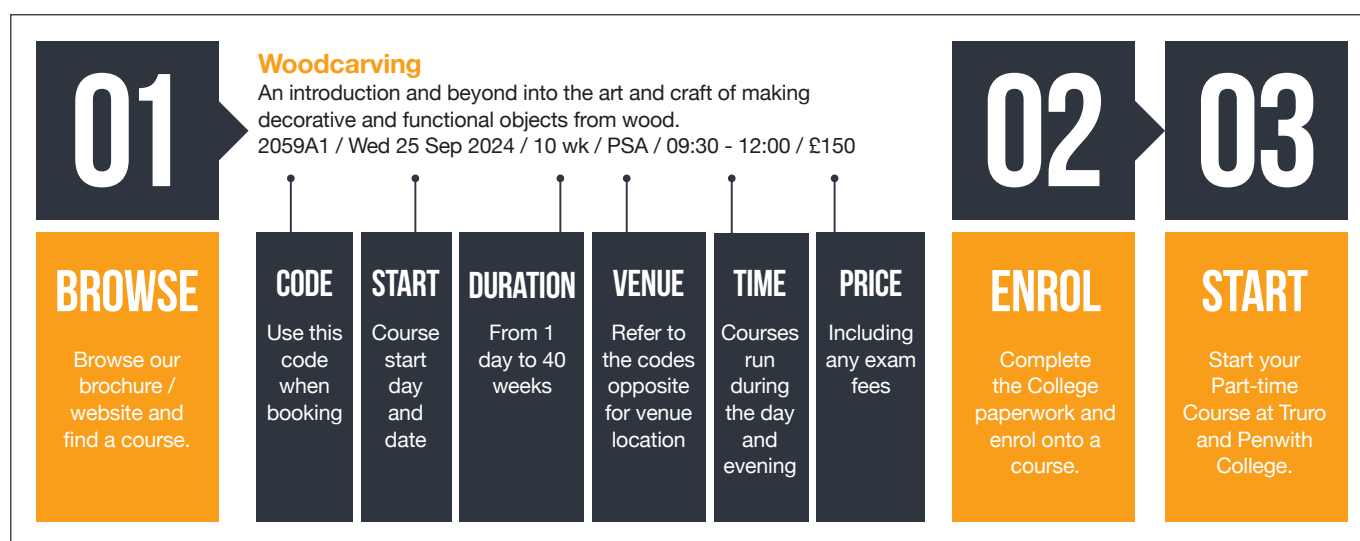

Printmaking at Penzance School of Art

"I have regularly attended the Adult Education printmaking classes since 2017.

"I was a beginner when I started, but I learnt so much from Mary over the 3 years to 2020 that I felt able to show some of my work at Open Studios Cornwall in September 2020, when I exhibited jointly with a friend in her studio in Newlyn. That is an indication of the confidence in my printmaking practice that I have developed through attending these classes.

"The lecturer has an exceptional breadth of knowledge about the printmaking processes, and is able to teach all the different techniques in a very thorough and friendly way, as well as answer the myriad questions about everything to do with printmaking that the wide variety of students ask. Printmaking is very wide-ranging in its various disciplines, and the lecturer has extensive command of their complexities.

"It has also always been a very supportive learning environment amongst the student group. We are all developing our skills and creativity alongside each other, and whatever our entry level, there is a natural openness and friendliness about sharing developing knowledge, facilitated by the lecturing staff's supportive attitude to our learning and to the entry of new students each term. So although the primary aim of the class is not social, we find that inevitably we build relationships through that sharing, and so attendance also has a social benefit aspect, as well as the learning one.

"In addition, the fact that there are morning, afternoon and evening sessions allows for flexibility of choice. I have been to different combinations of sessions over the last three years, which have meant meeting a variety of different people, as well as building on my relationships with a central cohort of regulars, and being able to develop my creativity and understanding of techniques."

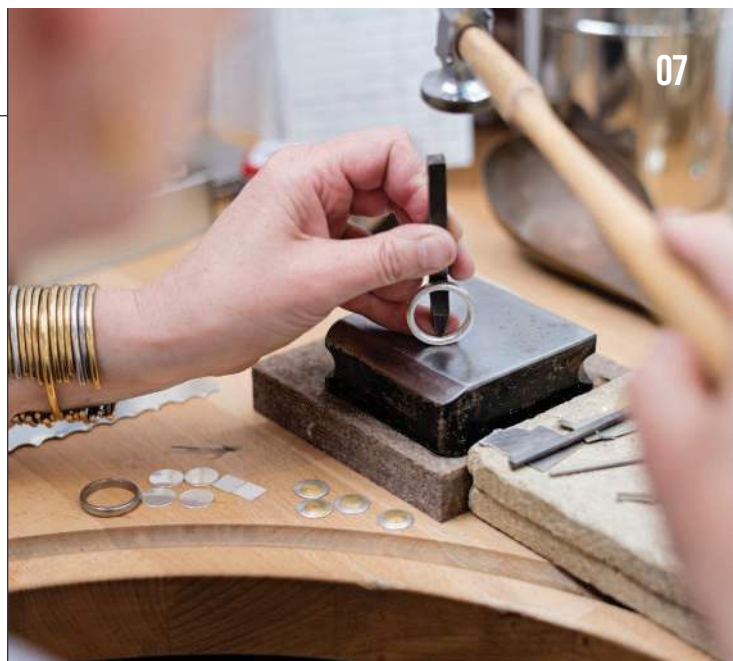

Jewellery Making in Silver & Copper for Beginners & Improvers

The first five sessions of this course will focus on project learning for beginners to introduce the fundamental skills needed to create jewellery from metal. You will learn how to use tools safely and effectively, while creating four or five pieces of jewellery. There is then the opportunity to design and create your own pieces using the skills you have learned and with support from your tutor. The course's later sessions will include lessons in different types of jewellery making or technique skills to further learning for those who have already established the basic skills of metal smithing. We will work predominantly in sterling silver but may also experiment with copper and brass. Please bring money to pay for materials, which are extra, and will need to be paid for each week (beginner set projects range from 70p - £5). Also, please bring a pen, notebook and wear closed toe shoes (no sandals or flip flops allowed in the workshop). Please note this course involves using various tools that may require strength and dexterity.

PENZANCE SCHOOL OF ART



Founded in 1853, Penzance School of Art, which is now part of Penwith College, was the first art school established west of Bristol.



The land was a gift by the town mayor, MP and banker, Charles Campbell Ross. The school was managed by a dynamic Frenchman, Henry Geoffroi, whose mission was to bring art to the common man and woman. In 1881 a grand, purpose-built school was opened, paid for by donations. The school was the pride of the town. Even Oscar Wilde was given a guided tour when he was lecturing nearby. This is the art school that you see today, next to the old library in Morrab Road.

Penzance School of Art can look back on an illustrious history. Not only did it help to shape Britain's art scene, but it has encouraged students with a passion for the arts to express their creativity. In 1984, Penzance School of Art was taken on by Cornwall County Council as an adult education centre. This responsibility was transferred to Penwith College in 1995.

Today, Penzance School of Art offers creative courses for all ages and abilities during the day and in the evening. Many courses are run by talented practising artists and craftspeople and their students thrive thanks to the high standards set. ● What is your background in education and your subject?

I trained in the Royal Academy of Dance syllabus and hold a 2:1 Degree in Theatre and Performance and have a PGCE in Education (incorporating the Diploma in the Lifelong Learning Sector). I was a professional dance practitioner until 1983 and a semi-professional dance practitioner to date.

● What inspired you to pursue a career in education?

My career encompasses Teaching, Choreographing and Performing Dance. I am passionate that dance should be fully accessible. I am aware that dance classes for adults are not as readily available as those that cater for children.
